CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS

Thanks for your interest in our *Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD) Training of Trainers (TOT) Trainer Certificate Program* conducted by the University of Wisconsin Departments of Professional Development and Applied Studies and Family Medicine. The certificate program provides science-based information on FASD; along with the skills, strategies, and materials to provide effective FASD education to health and allied health care providers and/or students

To earn the *Certificate*, participants must complete all of the requirements listed below. In fairness to all, we will not make exceptions to this policy. The *FASD Trainer Certificate* will be awarded after the trainee successfully completes the following:

1. Attend and fully participate in the March 7 – 11, 2011 TOT training in Verona, Wisconsin.
2. Complete and submit all pre-training and post-training evaluation surveys.
3. Complete and submit one written assignment.
4. Provide one individual or group oral presentation.
5. Pass the “TOT Educator Quiz” with a minimum of 75% proficiency.
6. Conduct and evaluate two (2) pre-approved trainings for at least 10 participants (total) within six months of completion of the in-person training. The trainings must utilize the content from the CDC’s “FASD Competency-Based Curriculum Development Guide for Medical and Allied Health Education and Practice”; and comply with the GLFRTC evaluation protocols.
7. Following each training, submit follow-up forms including completed evaluations, to the Great Lakes FASD Regional Training Center within two weeks of the activity.
